## Singleton historic church drive.

Take a short drive or a leisurely wonder around the various sites that make up Singleton's rich history. Be inspired by the architecture and the contents they hold and relax in the tranquil gardens that house these historical gems.



### 1 ST PATRICK'S CATHOLIC CHURCH

On the site of an earlier slab church built in 1845, the present Catholic Church was built in 1860. The large twin towers were added in 1920.



### 2 SISTERS OF MERCY CONVENT

Founded in 1875 when ten sisters from Ennis, Ireland arrived in Singleton. The sisters lived in the cottage at the front of the Convent. The main part of the present convent was erected in 1892.



### 3 ROMAN CATHOLIC PRESBYTERY

This large brick residence was built in 1890. Earlier, the Catholic Presbytery was located in the convent grounds and used as the first residence of the Sisters of Mercy.



### 4 ALL SAINTS' RECTORY

Built in 1875 in a Victorian Gothic style, this two storey brick rendered house has pierced quatrefoil balustrade, pine ceilings, Gothic fanlights and verandah as well as sash and French windows. The building was completed at a cost of 1,849 pounds.



### 5 ALL SAINTS' ANGLICAN CHURCH

Opened in 1913, this sandstone building has a slate roof, large pane windows, and four panel doors and is typically Victorian Gothic in spite of the date. Within the church's grounds there is also a Sunday School built in 1864 and a mausoleum erected in the 1860's to the memory of Henry Dangar, an early pioneer of the Hunter Valley. The original church on this site was the first to be designed in Australia by noted architect, Edmund Blacket. It was constructed in 1845 and demolished in 1907. The present church was a generous gift from AA Dangar, Henry's son. The Lych Gate was built in 1924.



### 6 ST ANDREW'S UNITING CHURCH

(Formally Presbyterian Church) Located on the corner of William and Church Streets. Foundation stone was laid 1904. The building has some fine tracery on Ravensfield stone and the roof is covered in Welsh slate.



### 7 PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

(Formally Methodist Church). Located in Elizabeth Street, the church was open for service on 5 February 1882. A pipe organ was installed as a memorial to peace after World War 1 and in 1928 memorial stained glass windows replaced the existing ones.
